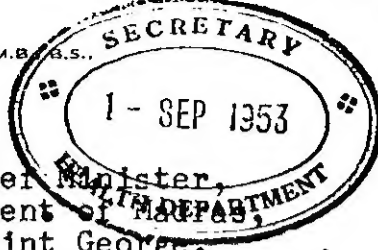

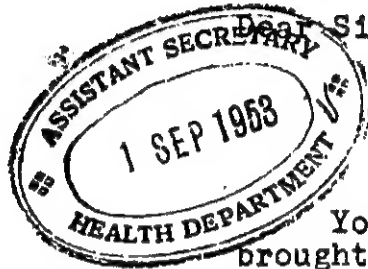

Dear Sir,
You are aware the Kasturba Medical College has been brought into existence by and under the management of Academy of General Education. The Academy has also under its management a first Grade College affiliated to the University of Madras called the Mahatma Gandhi Memorial College founded four years ago and a High School where Engineering is introduced as a bifurcated course. A copy of the Constitution of the Academy is sent enclosed for your information.

Any person who is a graduate of any recognised University in India could on payment of Rs. 25/- become a member of the Academy with a right to vote and voice in the management of the Academy.

A separate Trust has been created by the Academy for the purpose of managing the Kasturba Medical College. The Council of Trustees will be elected by the members of the Academy. A copy of the Trust Deed is also sent enclosed.

The cost of construction of buildings for the college its equipments and maintainance is expected to be a little over 30 lakhs of rupees. Though normally a medical college costs nearly double this amount, we, being a Private Agency, have all the advantage of chosing the best of materials and exercising utmost economy. Spreading this cost over a period of 10 years, the college is being built up on a co-operative basis, the parents of the students during the first 10 years mutually co-operating the share the burden on an uniform scale. In the absence of any financial grant by the Government to this college, the college is sought to be made into a full fledged medical college by this me-

thod. We are grateful to the Government of Madras for assuring us elinical facilities both at Mangalore and Udipi. The birth and growth of this institution, in fact, is a true lesson in modern times as to what an amount of good is possible by fruitful public co-operation, supported by the Government. We have had already ten dead bodies for dissection and satisfactory arrangements have been made both in respect of staff as well as equipment. The observations of the Director of Medical Services who was recently here and of Dr. B.H.Padmanabha Pai, M.D., formerly the Professor of Medicine of the Madras Medical College and Dr. K.C.Nambiar, President of the Indian Medical Association, South Indian Provincial Branch are also enclosed for your information.

A It is our desire that the Government of Madras must also have a voice in the management of the College in view of the facilities that it has been giving to the College. We wish to provide if you will permit us, that on the council of management there should be a nominee of the Government of Madras as one of the Trustees. The T.A. etc., of this nominee will be borne by the Academy and hence will not entail any expenditure for the Government.

B It is also our great desire that you should make it convenient to go over here very early, visit the College and satisfy yourself about the progress it has been making.

Dr. T.Madhava Pai had taken me round to the Anatomy and Physiology blocks of the Kasturba Medical College at Manipal to-day. Both the departments are equipped according to the requirements. The Physiology Department is at present stationed in a building where temporary arrangements have been made for practical work in histology, experimental physiology and bio-chemistry. There is a proposal for the construction of a new physiology block for which plans have been drawn up and the work commenced. The Anatomy block is a complete unit in itself.

Although the college was opened very recently, the teaching of students is done without any difficulty as all the necessary staff are appointed and the required equipment obtained. In course of time it should be possible to develop the museum for the Anatomy department.

Dr. Madhava Pai is to be congratulated for getting this college started well. This is a new venture and there is every sign of the College getting established fulfilling the conditions necessary for a teaching institution as required by the Indian Medical Council.

The Students are accommodated in hostels close to the Medical College and it is very pleasing to know that within a short time the rooms are suitably furnished and the students are given all the amenities possible.

I am quite sure that Dr. Madhava Pai and the members of the Academy will be able to achieve the objects for which the Academy stands.

This deed of Trust is executed by the Academy of General Education, Manipal, through its Registrar Dr. Tonse Madhava Anantha Pai, son of Tonse Anantha Pai, Gowdsarasvath Brahmin, residing in Manipal of Shivalli Village, Udipi Taluk (hereinafter called "the Author of the Trust").

WHEREAS the Academy of General Education was founded and registered for the purpose of rendering aid and co-operation in the field of education in Udipi and elsewhere;

AND WHEREAS the spreading of education, taking into account and consideration the present needs and the circumstances felt and experienced, can best be brought about by opening new Colleges;

AND WHEREAS the Author of the Trust has already founded and is running an Arts College at Udipi called "The Mahatma Gandhi Memorial College."

AND WHEREAS the necessity of a Medical College in South Kanara District is keenly felt and for the purpose of founding such a College, various persons working and exerting themselves in that behalf, sought the co-operation of the Author of the Trust and the members of the Author of the Trust have bestowed their serious thought on matters relating thereto and deemed it to be proper for the furtherance of the object of the Academy of General Education, to co-operate with the persons so striving in founding a Medical College;

AND WHEREAS the Supreme Governing Body of the said Academy has in its Meeting held on the 15th day of September 1951 passed a resolution sanctioning the founding of a Medical College at Manipal;

AND WHEREAS the Karnataka University by their letter No.13093/of 1952 dated 7-8-1952 have agreed to give affiliation for the M.B.B.S.course in the said College;

AND WHEREAS the Government of Madras by their letter No.3048 (Health) dated 25-9-1952 have agreed to permit the Government Hospitals at Mangalore and Udipi being used for the clinical training of the students and to alienate Government vacant land in Udipi in favour of the College when specified proposals are received;

AND WHEREAS the Registrar of the said Academy by his letter dated 14-11-1952 requested the said Government for permission of technical assistance and advice from the various Departmental Heads like Physiology, Anatomy and Bio-Chemistry etc., and the said Government by their letter No.53947 Q/52-3 (Health) dated 20-11-1952 have intimated that they have instructed the Director of Medical Services to render all assistance as desired in the aforesaid letter dated 14-11-1952;

AND WHEREAS it is now the desire of the Author of the Trust to execute a requisite Deed of Trust setting forth the terms, conditions and provisions thereof for the proper, permanent and efficient administration of the Trust;

NOW THIS DEED WITNESSES AS FOLLOWS:-

1. The Trust shall be styled "The Kasturba Medical College Trust, Manipal"
2. The Author of the Trust hereby transfers to the Trustee 100 fully paid 5 per cent cumulative preference shares numbered PC 67097 to PC 67196 of the canara Industrial & Banking Syndicate

Ltd., Udipi, to be held by them upon trust for the benefit and use as is hereinafter provided and has vested the same in the Trustees for the purposes of the Trust. The present value of these shares is Rs.1,000/- (One thousand).

3. The Trust shall be irrevocable so long as the existence and the object for which the Medical College is founded and are carried on.

4. The Trust will be managed by the Council of Management of the proposed Kasturba Medical College, Manipal, consisting of the Principal of the said College and not less than three and not more than nine members elected by the Academy of General Education, Manipal, as hereinafter provided.

5. The Trustees appointed for the purpose of carrying out the objects and terms of the Trust are for the present the following members constituting the present Council of Management of the proposed Kasturba Medical College, Manipal, as these are the only persons in the Administrative Committee of the said Academy who hold degrees in Allopathic Medicine and they shall be deemed as "elected Trustees" for the purposes of the Trust:-

1. Dr. Sunder Ram Pai, son of Udiyavar Ananthayya alias Sheshagiri Pai, Gowdsarasvath Brahmin, Medical Practitioner, residing in Udipi Town.
2. Dr. Tonse Madhava Anantha Pai, son of Tonse Anantha Pai, Managing Director of the Canara Industrial & Banking Syndicate Ltd., Udipi, residing in Manipal of Shivalli Village, Udipi Taluk.
3. Dr. Kodavur Laxminarayana Aithal, son of subraya Aithal, Shivalli Brahmin, Medical Practitioner, residing in Udipi Town.

Trustee. The "elected Trustees" along with the "ex-officio Trustee" shall constitute the Board of Trustees.

6. The Trustees shall take charge of the Trust assets and hold and administer the same in accordance with the terms of the Trust.

7. As it is mainly due to the efforts of the said Dr. Tonse Madhava Anantha Pai that facilities in the manner stated above were secured from the Karnataka University and the Government of Madras, the said Dr. Tonse Madhava Anantha Pai shall be the Registrar, Treasurer and Correspondent and he shall hold these offices and trusteeship during his life-time and shall be known and sign all papers as "Registrar, Kasturba Medical College Trust" or "Registrar, Kasturba Medical College" or as the Registrar of any hospital or any institution connected therewith as may be required. On his death or resignation, the Author of the Trust shall appoint one of the Trustees as Registrar-Treasurer-Correspondent. The Principal of the College shall be the Secretary and be in charge of and shall be responsible for the safe custody of all records of the Trust.

8. The Trustees shall elect from among the elected Trustees a President. The President of the Board of Trustees shall preside at all the Meetings of the Board and in his absence the Registrar shall be the President of such Meetings.

9. (i) The Secretary shall convene the Meetings of the Trust and shall maintain a regular record of all such Meetings.

(11) The Registrar shall receive and disburse all the moneys of the Trust and maintain or cause to be maintained proper accounts of the same. He shall also be entitled to receive all moneys, money-orders, correspondence, registered articles and insured articles addressed to the Principal, Kasturba Medical College or any other institution connected with it.

10. Any casual vacancy occurring on the Board of Trustees by resignation, death or otherwise, may be filled up by the other Trustees by nomination from among the persons holding the requisite qualifications as laid down in para 12 below, but, the person so chosen shall be subject to retirement at the same time as if he had become a Trustee on the day on which the Trustee in whose place he is appointed was elected a Trustee and until that nomination by the Trustees, the remaining Trustees for the time being shall continue to administer the Trust.

11 (i) Any two Trustees, may, in writing, requisition the Secretary to convene a Meeting of the Board of Trustees and thereupon the Secretary shall convene the Meeting of the Board of Trustees after giving seven days' notice of such Meeting to the Trustees. In case the Secretary fails to respond to the requisition of those Trustees, the said Trustees themselves may convene a Meeting of the Trustees giving notice of the time of the Meeting to the Trustees and the decisions arrived at such Meeting shall be as good, valid and binding as if they are the decisions arrived at the Meeting of the Board of Trustees duly convened.

(ii) The Registrar shall at all times be competent to call a Meeting of the Board of Trustees suo motto.

12. At the end of every five years, three from among the elected Trustees whose term of office is the longest shall retire & their place shall be filled by election. The election qualifications and conditions of office of Trustees shall be as laid down by the general body of the Academy of General Education from time to time. The retiring Trustees are however eligible for re-election and shall continue to hold office until the election of fresh trustees. But, no member of the said Academy who does not hold a degree in Allopathic Medicine shall be eligible for election as a Trustee. The said Dr. Tonse Madhava Anantha Pai shall not be subject to retirement.

13. The Trustees shall be competent and are hereby empowered.

(a) to receive any more and further assets in any shape or form as and when given by the Author of the Trust or any other person.

(b) to invest the Trust funds from time to time in such securities, shares, stock, Bank-deposits, debentures, Government Promissory Notes, etc., and in such manner as they deem fit and also to receive, collect or realise or cause collection or realisation of all interest, dividends, bonus or premium to accrue due on all or any such stock, funds, securities, shares debentures or deeds or documents of like nature.

(c) to create endowments for or otherwise to institute scholarships and prizes for the students of the above College.

(d) to acquire, to sell, mortgage, to lease out or transfer in any manner properties movable or immovable, to construct buildings and other improvements for the purpose of the Trust and to manage and to deal with properties, moveable or immovable and all other assets of the Trust and to pledge them

to raise funds, to repay loans or otherwise and to deal generally with the assets for any other purpose of the Trust.

(e) To borrow for the purposes of the Trust on personal credit of the Trustees or on the personal credit of the Trust with or without charge and responsibility upon the assets of the Trust.

(f) to meet all the necessary expenses incurred or to be incurred in connection with the creation and execution of this Trust, which shall be borne by the Trust.

14. All or any of the powers vested in or exercisable by the Trustees as per this Trust Deed shall be capable of being performed or exercised by a majority of the Trustees present at the Meeting of the Board of Trustees and any action or decision of such majority shall be as valid and effective as it would have been if done by all the Trustees. If, however, in the opinion of the Registrar the calling of the meeting of the Trustees is impracticable for any reason, a resolution passed by the unanimous consent of the Trustees by circulation of papers shall be as valid and effective as if passed by the majority of the Trustees at a duly convened Meeting.

15. The office of the Trustees will be honorary and the Trustees are not entitled to draw any remuneration or travelling allowance for carrying out their duties unless the Academy of General Education otherwise directs. The Board of Trustees shall meet from time to time (but not later than 2 months from the meeting held last) as and when necessary to transact business and for considering the betterment of the Trust and its assets. The quorum for the meeting of the Board of Trustees shall be three. The President of the Board of Trustees shall have a casting vote in case of equality of votes. Notice of all Meetings of the Board either by ordinary post or otherwise shall be given to all the Trustees and for this purpose the posting of a communication addressed to the Trustees shall be deemed to be sufficient notice.

16. The Trustees shall cause true and correct accounts to be kept of the sums of moneys received and expended on behalf of the Trust. Once at least in every year, the account of the Trust shall be examined and the correctness of the accounts and the Balance Sheet ascertained by an Auditor appointed by the Trustees and counter-signed by the Auditor and the President of the Board of Trustees. Such audited Balance Sheet shall form an Appendix to the Balance Sheet of the Academy of General Education.

17. Subject as aforesaid, the Trustees shall have power from time to time to make and alter such rules and regulations with regard to the conduct of the business and all matters in respect of any power or duty hereby vested in them, as they may think proper.

18. The Board of Trustees, if they so choose and for the benefit of the Trust, may delegate by means of a resolution in writing any or all of their powers to any one or more of them or any other person or persons for such time and purpose as they deem fit.

19. The Registrar shall be the person authorised to execute or negotiate all the necessary papers and documents such as pronotes, bills, cheques, hundis or any other negotiable or non-negotiable instruments such as bonds, mortgages

pledges, agreements, conveyances, transfers, etc., and he shall also have power to receive moneys and other assets, to grant receipts and discharges on behalf of the Trust.

20. The Registrar shall be the person authorised also to negotiate transfer and give discharge for all Government and other securities including Government Promissory Notes, National Savings Certificates, Treasury Bonds, Municipal and other loans and debentures, shares of Joint stock companies and insurance policies assigned to or standing in the name of Kasturba Medical-College Trust, Kasturba Medical College, hospital and any other institution connected therewith and to collect all interest, dividends and other moneys receivable in respect of the above.

21. Should any occasion arise for any proceedings to be instituted or defended in any Court Civil, Criminal or Revenue or before any authorities such as District Board, Municipality, Income-tax Department, Education Department, Registration Department, Postal Authorities or any tribunal constituted by law, the Registrar or such other person or persons as are to be appointed in this behalf by means of a resolution by the Board of Trustees alone shall be competent to represent the Trust, to sign and verify complaints, pleadings, applications, to compromise or refer to arbitration whole or any part of the claim by or against the Trust and he alone shall be competent to engage Lawyers and to take all necessary steps and incur all expenses in that behalf.

22. The Trustees shall be at liberty to add to or alter or abrogate any of the provisions of the Trust consistent with the objects of the Trust, provided that such resolution has the support of all the "elected Trustees".

23. The Trustees are wholly indemnified against any expenses and losses incurred or suffered or any payments made by them in the administration of the Trust and such expenses, losses and payments shall be borne by the Trust and none of the Trustees shall in any way be personally liable, or responsible for the same except to the extent mentioned in para 13 (e) supra.

24. The object of the Trust is to establish, manage and run the Kasturba Medical College, its hostel, maternity homes and hospitals at Manipal or in such other places as the Board of Trustees may from time to time decide. All such connected institutions, the properties and assets attached to or belonging to them or moneys received by them or standing in their names shall be deemed to be the properties of this Trust and shall be controlled and managed by it. The Registrar shall have the same powers and responsibilities in respect of such properties, assets and moneys as he has in respect of the other assets of this Trust. He may, however, keep separate accounts in respect of each institution and transfer the funds of one institution to another as and when found necessary. In case the said College ceases to exist or function, the entire Trust assets then existing shall revert to and vest in the Author of the Trust.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the above said Dr. Tonse Madhava Anantha Pai, on behalf of the Academy of General Education Manipal, has signed this deed on the 6th day of December 1952.

MEMORANDUM OF ASSOCIATION.

1. The Institution shall be called **THE ACADEMY OF GENERAL EDUCATION**, herein-after called the 'Academy'.

2. The Academy shall be situate at Manipal, in the Presidency of Madras.

3. The objects for which the Academy is established are:—

(a) to make available technical & commercial education comprising, 1. Agriculture, 2. Fruit Culture and marketing, 3. Cattle farm, 4. Bee-keeping and Poultry, 5. Sanitation, 6. Radio servicing, 7. Motor Engineering, 8. Minor Mechanical Engineering, 9. Major Mechanical Engineering, 10. Electrical Engineering, 11. Wiring, 12. Photography, 13. Printing, 14. Salesmanship—Shop assistants, 15. Cinema—Projection, 16. Survey, 17. Nursing and Midwifery, 18. Banking, 19. Insurance, 20. Weaving, 21. Masonry, 22. Smithery, 23. Civil Engineering, 24. Architecture—designing, 25. Pottery, 26. Wireless Telegraphy, 27. Journalism, 28. Advertisement, 29. Office Management, 30. Jewellery—Precious stones, 31. Painting, 32. Industrial Chemistry, 33. Paper Manufacturing, 34. Cutting and Tailoring, 35. Music: Vocal and Instrumental, 36. Tanning, 37. Embroidery, 38. Sculpture, 39. Domestic Science, 40. Compounding, 41. Shorthand and Typewriting, (Junior and Senior), 42. Accountancy, 43. Glass Manufacture, 44. Rattan Works, 45. Tile Manufacturing, 46. Building construction, 47. Moulding and such other subjects as may be decided upon by the Academy from time to time;

(b) to devise ways and means and accord facilities for candidates to specialise in all or any of the above courses;

(c) to give training in technical, commercial or any other form of education, as may be adopted by the Academy from time to time, in such a way as to enable candidates, who find themselves stranded in life for want of or with the present educational qualifications, to eke out their livelihood. Training includes theoretical, practical and lecturing;

(d) to find out ways and means for solving unemployment problem;

(e) to issue certificates, diplomas etc;

(f) to make the objects of the Academy popular among the classes and the masses;

(g) to enrol members and to collect funds, by membership fees, donations, subscriptions or by such other sources as may be deemed expedient, for running the Academy;

(h) to establish, support, manage or conduct Schools, Colleges or such other Institutions as may be decided by the Academy;

- (i) to arrange social gatherings, literary associations, lectures and debates. ~~for~~ the benefit of students;
 - (j) to amalgamate or affiliate any other Institution whose objects and interests may in any manner directly or indirectly be substantially identical with, or advance, the objects or interests of the Academy;
 - (k) to train students to be men of character and efficiency;
 - (l) to acquire, purchase or sell, any or all movable or immovable properties; to acquire by purchase or otherwise any rights or privileges including rights on immovable properties;
 - (m) to invest and deal with all the moneys of the Academy upon such securities and in such manner as may from time to time be determined by the Academy including shares of joint stock Banks;
 - (n) to pay either in cash or otherwise for any property or rights acquired and services rendered to the Academy;
 - (o) to borrow, raise or otherwise procure moneys on the security of movable, immovable or other assets of the Academy, or otherwise for carrying on all or any of the objects of the Academy, at the discretion of the Administrative Committee.
 - (p) to do all or any of the above things, transactions or matters, either alone or in conjunction with others, either by or through servants, employees or otherwise, and to do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects or any of them.

4. We, the several individuals, whose names and addresses are subscribed hereinbelow are desirous of being formed into a Registered Body in pursuance of this Memorandum of Association and have signed against our names herebelow:

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION.

(As amended up to 25-1-1947.)

1. The Office of the Academy shall be situate at Manipal.
2. Any person of any age shall be eligible for enrolment as:
 - (a) Life Member, paying Rs. 1000/- in a lump sum;
 - (b) Fellow, paying Rs. 25/-, who shall be (1) a graduate of any recognised University, or (2) an Associate of the Academy of three years' standing; nevertheless the Head of a religious institution by becoming an Associate shall automatically be eligible for fellowship by paying an additional sum of Rs. 25/-;
 - (c) An Associate paying Rs. 5/-, (1) who is or was an executive head of any business or social institution as Secretary, Director, Treasurer, President etc., otherwise

qualified according to rules framed by the Supreme Governing Body or (2) who has passed an examination conducted by the Academy for the purpose in any of the several courses of study recognised by the Academy;

- (d) Ordinary member (1) who pays Re. 1/- and desires instruction under the Academy or (2) who pays As. 4/- annually and holds concurrent views on the objects and is convinced of the advisability of having this Academy, in default of annual subscription ceasing to be a member.

3. The Supreme Governing Body, hereinafter defined, may, in their absolute discretion and without assigning any reason therefor, decline or refuse to enrol any person or persons as a life member, a fellow, an associate or as an ordinary member of the Academy.

4. The four classes of members as defined in Article 2 above, shall constitute the General Body of the Academy.

5. A member desirous of resigning his membership shall inform the Manager in writing to that effect.

6. Any person ceasing to be a member of the Academy from any cause whatsoever shall forthwith cease to have any rights, or other incidents of membership and he shall not be entitled for refund of any membership fee paid.

7. Each member, who has attained majority, (i. e., more than 18 years) shall have a vote.

8. The General Body shall elect from 25 to 100 members from among themselves, excluding the Life Members, to constitute the Supreme Governing Body, the heads of religious institutions who are founder-members of the Supreme Governing Body shall not however be subject to election.

9. In addition to Life Members, the elected members to the Supreme Governing Body shall be in the following proportion: 60% graduate Fellows, 20% other Fellows and 20% Associates.

10. Only Fellows & Associates can stand for election to the Supreme Governing Body and the Ordinary Members shall have only the power of voting.

11. When a person becomes a Life Member, he shall automatically be included in the Supreme Governing Body.

12. The Annual General Body Meeting in which the election to the Supreme Governing Body is to be conducted shall be held every year at 4 P. M. on the last Sunday of January at the office of the Academy or at any other place notified by the Registrar. The notice of this meeting shall be published every year in the December issue of the "Human Affairs", the approved organ of the Academy.

13. The affairs and concerns of the Academy, all funds and assets belonging to the Academy or which may hereafter belong to it shall be vested in and managed by the Supreme Governing Body, which is answerable to the General Body.

14. The members of the Supreme Governing Body shall elect from among themselves a (1) President, (2) Vice-President, (3) Registrar, (4) Manager and five more members to constitute the Administrative Committee, which shall be directly responsible to the Supreme Governing Body.

15. The Supreme Governing Body shall meet as often as necessary and when convened.

16. The Administrative Committee shall meet whenever found necessary.

17. The quorum for the meetings of the General Body, Supreme Governing Body and the Administrative Committee shall be three.

18. (a) At the General Body Meeting in every year, one third of the members of the Supreme Governing Body for the time being, or if their number is not a multiple of three, then the number nearest to one third, shall retire from office, excepting life members, Heads of religious institutions who are founder-members of the Supreme Governing Body, the Registrar and the Manager.

(b) The members to retire in every year shall be those who have been longest in office since their last election, but as between persons who became members on the same day those to retire shall (unless they otherwise agree among themselves) be determined by lot.

(c) A retiring member shall be eligible for re-election

19. The Supreme Governing Body can co-opt any fellow or associate to fill up a vacancy and the person so co-opted shall be subject to retirement at the same time as if he had become a member on the day on which the member on whose place he is appointed was last elected a member of the Supreme Governing Body.

20. The Supreme Governing Body shall have power from time to time, to delete, amend, or add any articles, any bye-laws, rules and regulations, as may be recommended by the Administrative Committee and the same shall be placed before the subsequent General Body Meeting of the Academy for their information.

21. All proceedings of the meetings of the Academy, particulars of candidates who stand for election to the Supreme Governing Body and result thereof and all relevant matters relating to the working of the Academy may be published in the approved organ of the Academy, "Human Affairs" for convenience of economical intimation to members.

22. The Supreme Governing Body can co-opt and confer fellowship on any Associate if the Administrative Committee so recommends.

All candidates who intend undergoing training in the Academy shall enlist themselves first as members against payment of Re. 1/-. They are not eligible for election to the Supreme Governing Body, but are entitled to vote, if they are majors pursuant to Article 7.

24. All committees or sub-committees constituted by the Supreme Governing Body or the General Body shall be directly under the Supreme Governing Body.

25. A member of the Supreme Governing Body ceases to hold office if he or she:

- (a) becomes of unsound mind;
- (b) is convicted of any offence which involves moral turpitude;
- (c) is absent from any five consecutive meetings of the Supreme Governing Body without leave of absence.

26. Questions arising at any meeting of the Supreme Governing Body shall be decided by a majority of votes and the Chairman who presides over the meeting shall have a casting vote in matters of a tie.

27. The Registrar shall be empowered to convene meetings of the Administrative Committee and the Supreme Governing Body.

28. Any decisions taken in the meeting of the Supreme Governing Body or the Administrative Committee, where there is a quorum, shall be considered to be of the same effect as that which is passed under the signatures of all the members of the Supreme Governing Body or the Administrative Committee.

29. (1) The President shall preside over all the meetings of the General Body, the Supreme Governing Body and the Administrative Committee and shall have a casting vote in case of a tie.

(2) The Vice-President shall act in the absence of the President and shall have all the powers of the President in his absence and in the absence of the Vice-President, the Registrar, and in the absence of the Registrar, any other member of the Administrative Committee elected by the members present.

(3) The Registrar may be a whole time or part time paid officer at the discretion of the Administrative Committee, whose duty shall include scrutiny and recommendation of applications from candidates to the Administrative Committee, as also connected work in admission, issue of diplomas, certificates and fellowships and the like and he shall sign such certificates etc.

(4) The Manager, who may be a whole time or part time paid officer at the discretion of the Administrative Committee, shall for all purposes, be the chief executive Officer and also shall execute or carry out the proceedings and directions of the General Body, the Supreme Governing Body and the Administrative Committee, and shall cause to maintain accounts etc., of the Academy.

30. The Supreme Governing Body shall be responsible for the conduct of the affairs of the Academy and, as such, shall exercise all relevant powers, consistent with these presents, or as may be determined by the General Body from time to time.

31. Any Member desirous of moving any resolution or resolutions, either in the Supreme Governing Body or in the General Body, shall give one month's notice of his intention of doing so, with a copy of such resolution or resolutions.

32. The Manager shall record all the proceedings of the meetings of the General Body, the Supreme Governing Body, and the Administrative Committee as well as the names of the members present at such meetings.

33. The Supreme Governing Body shall place before the General Body every year audited accounts of the Academy for approval.

34. The General Body may affiliate to the Academy or affiliate the Academy to any other institution having substantially the same objects in common and such affiliation shall be on the terms decided by the General Body.

35. All Lecturers and Examiners of the Academy shall be Fellows of the Academy.

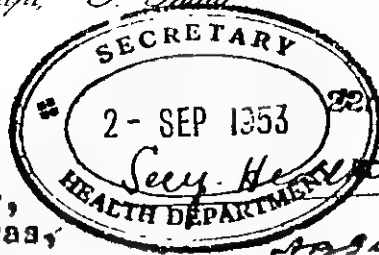

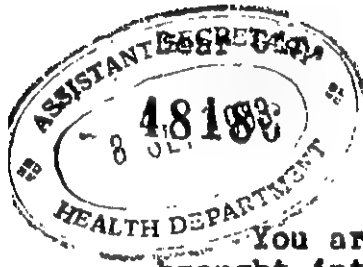

You are aware the Kasturba Medical College has been brought into existence by and under the management of Academy of General Education. The Academy has also under its management a first Grade College affiliated to the University of Madras called the Mahatma Gandhi Memorial College founded four years ago and a High School where Engineering is introduced as a bifurcated course. A copy of the Constitution of the Academy is sent enclosed for your information.

Any person who is a graduate of any recognised University in India could on payment of Rs.25/- become a member of the Academy with a right to vote and voice in the management of the Academy.

A separate Trust has been created by the Academy for the purpose of managing the Kasturba Medical College. The Council of Trustees will be elected by the members of the Academy. A copy of the Trust Deed is also sent enclosed.

The cost of construction of buildings for the college its equipments and maintainance is expected to be a little over 30 lakhs of rupees. Though normally a medical college costs nearly double this amount, we, being a Private Agency, have all the advantage of chosing the best of materials and exercising utmost economy. Spreading this cost over a period of 10 years, the college is being built up on a co-operative basis, the parents of the students during the first 10 years mutually co-operating the share the burden on an uniform scale. In the absence of any financial grant by the Government to this college, the college is sought to be made into a full fledged medical college by this me-

thod. We are grateful to the Government of Madras for assuring us clinical facilities both at Mangalore and Udipi. This deed of Trust is executed by the Academy of General Education, Manipal, through its Registrar Dr. Tonse Madhava Anantha Pai, son of Tonse Anantha Pai, Gowdsarasvath Brahmin, residing in Manipal of Shivalli Village, Udipi Taluk (hereinafter called "the Author of the Trust").

WHEREAS the Academy of General Education was founded and registered for the purpose of rendering aid and co-operation in the field of education in Udipi and elsewhere;

AND WHEREAS the spreading of education, taking into account and consideration the present needs and the circumstances felt and experienced, can best be brought about by opening new Colleges;

AND WHEREAS the Author of the Trust has already founded and is running an Arts College at Udipi called "The Mahatma Gandhi Memorial College.

AND WHEREAS the necessity of a Medical College in South Kanara District is keenly felt and for the purpose of founding such a College, various persons working and exerting themselves in that behalf, sought the co-operation of the Author of the Trust and the members of the Author of the Trust have bestowed their serious thought on matters relating thereto and deemed it to be proper for the furtherance of the object of the Academy of General Education, to co-operate with the persons so striving in founding a Medical College;

AND WHEREAS the Supreme Governing Body of the said Academy has in its Meeting held on the 15th day of September 1951 passed a resolution sanctioning the founding of a Medical College at Manipal;

AND WHEREAS the Karnataka University by their letter No.13093/of 1952 dated 7-8-1952 have agreed to give affiliation for the M.B.B.S.course in the said College;

AND WHEREAS the Government of Madras by their letter No.3048 (Health) dated 25-9-1952 have agreed to permit the Government Hospitals at Mangalore and Udipi being used for the clinical training of the students and to alienate Government vacant land in Udipi in favour of the College when specified proposals are received;

AND WHEREAS the Registrar of the said Academy by his letter dated 14-11-1952 requested the said Government for permission of technical assistance and advice from the various Departmental Heads like Physiology, Anatomy and Bio-Chemistry etc., and the said Government by their letter No.53947 Q/52-3 (Health) dated 20-11-1952 have intimated that they have instructed the Director of Medical Services to render all assistance as desired in the aforesaid letter dated 14-11-1952;

AND WHEREAS it is now the desire of the Author of the Trust to execute a requisite Deed of Trust setting forth the terms, conditions and provisions thereof for the proper, permanent and efficient administration of the Trust;

NOW THIS DEED WITNESSES AS FOLLOWS:-

1. The Trust shall be styled "The Kasturba Medical College Trust, Manipal".
2. The Author of the Trust hereby transfers to the Truste
100 fully paid 5 per cent cumulative preference shares numbered
PC 67097 to PC 67196 of the canara Industrial & Banking Syndi

Ltd., Udipi, to be held by them upon trust for the benefit and use as is hereinafter provided and has vested the same in the Trustees for the purposes of the Trust. The present value of these shares is Rs.1,000/- (One thousand).

3. The Trust shall be irrevocable so long as the existence and the object for which the Medical College is founded and are carried on.

4. The Trust will be managed by the Council of Management of the proposed Kasturba Medical College, Manipal, consisting of the Principal of the said College and not less than three and not more than nine members elected by the Academy of General Education, Manipal, as hereinafter provided.

5. The Trustees appointed for the purpose of carrying out the objects and terms of the Trust are for the present the following members constituting the present Council of Management of the proposed Kasturba Medical College, Manipal, as these are the only persons in the Administrative Committee of the said Academy who hold degrees in Allopathic Medicine and they shall be deemed as "elected Trustees" for the purposes of the Trust:-

1. Dr. Sunder Ram Pai, son of Udiyavar Ananthayya alias Sheshagiri Pai, Gowdsarasvath Brahmin, Medical Practitioner, residing in Udipi Town.
2. Dr. Tonse Madhava Anantha Pai, son of Tonse Anantha Pai, Managing Director of the Canara Industrial & Banking Syndicate Ltd., Udipi, residing in Manipal of Shivalli Village, Udipi Taluk.
3. Dr. Kodavur Laxminarayana Aithal, son of subraya Aithal, Shivalli Brahmin, Medical Practitioner, residing in Udipi Town.

Trustee. The "elected Trustees" along with the "ex-officio Trustee" shall constitute the Board of Trustees.

6. The Trustees shall take charge of the Trust assets and hold and administer the same in accordance with the terms of the Trust.

7. As it is mainly due to the efforts of the said Dr. Tonse Madhava Anantha Pai that facilities in the manner stated above were secured from the Karnataka University and the Government of Madras, the said Dr. Tonse Madhava Anantha Pai shall be the Registrar, Treasurer and Correspondent and he shall hold these offices and trusteeship during his life-time and shall be known and sign all papers as "Registrar, Kasturba Medical College Trust" or "Registrar, Kasturba Medical College" or as the Registrar of any hospital or any institution connected therewith as may be required. On his death or resignation, the Author of the Trust shall appoint one of the Trustees as Registrar-Treasurer-Correspondent. The Principal of the College shall be the Secretary and be in charge of and shall be responsible for the safe custody of all records of the Trust.

8. The Trustees shall elect from among the elected Trustees a President. The President of the Board of Trustees shall preside at all the Meetings of the Board and in his absence the Registrar shall be the President of such Meetings.

9. (1) The Secretary shall convene the Meetings of the Trust and shall maintain a regular record of all such Meetings.

(11) The Registrar shall receive and disburse all the moneys of the Trust and maintain or cause to be maintained proper accounts of the same. He shall also be entitled to receive all moneys, money-orders, correspondence, registered articles and insured articles addressed to the Principal, Kasturba Medical College or any other institution connected with it.

10. Any casual vacancy occurring on the Board of Trustees by resignation, death or otherwise, may be filled up by the other Trustees by nomination from among the persons holding the requisite qualifications as laid down in para 12 below, but, the person so chosen shall be subject to retirement at the same time as if he had become a Trustee on the day on which the Trustee in whose place he is appointed was elected a Trustee and until that nomination by the Trustees, the remaining Trustees for the time being shall continue to administer the Trust.

11 (i) Any two Trustees, may, in writing, requisition the Secretary to convene a Meeting of the Board of Trustees and thereupon the Secretary shall convene the Meeting of the Board of Trustees after giving seven days' notice of such Meeting to the Trustees. In case the Secretary fails to respond to the requisition of those Trustees, the said Trustees themselves may convene a Meeting of the Trustees giving notice of the time of the Meeting to the Trustees and the decisions arrived at such Meeting shall be as good, valid and binding as if they are the decisions arrived at the Meeting of the Board of Trustees duly convened.

(ii) The Registrar shall at all times be competent to call a Meeting of the Board of Trustees suo motto.

12. At the end of every five years, three from among the elected Trustees whose term of office is the longest shall retire & their place shall be filled by election. The election qualifications and conditions of office of Trustees shall be as laid down by the general body of the Academy of General Education from time to time. The retiring Trustees are however eligible for re-election and shall continue to hold office until the election of fresh trustees. But, no member of the said Academy who does not hold a degree in Allopathic Medicine shall be eligible for election as a Trustee. The said Dr. Tonse Madhava Anantha Pai shall not be subject to retirement.

13. The Trustees shall be competent and are hereby empowered.

(a) to receive any more and further assets in any shape or form as and when given by the Author of the Trust or any other person.

(b) to invest the Trust funds from time to time in such securities, shares, stock, Bank deposits, debentures, Government Promissory Notes, etc., and in such manner as they deem fit and also to receive, collect or realise or cause collection or realisation of all interest, dividends, bonus or premium to accrue due on all or any such stock, funds, securities, shares debentures or deeds or documents of like nature.

(c) to create endowments for or otherwise to institute scholarships and prizes for the students of the above College.

(d) to acquire, to sell, mortgage, to lease out or transfer in any manner properties movable or immoveable, to construct buildings and other improvements for the purpose of the Trust and to manage and to deal with properties, moveable or immoveable and all other assets of the Trust and to pledge them

to raise funds, to repay loans or otherwise and to deal generally with the assets for any other purpose of the Trust.

(e) To borrow for the purposes of the Trust on personal credit of the Trustees or on the personal credit of the Trust with or without charge and responsibility upon the assets of the Trust.

(f) to meet all the necessary expenses incurred or to be incurred in connection with the creation and execution of this Trust, which shall be borne by the Trust.

14. All or any of the powers vested in or exercisable by the Trustees as per this Trust Deed shall be capable of being performed or exercised by a majority of the Trustees present at the Meeting of the Board of Trustees and any action or decision of such majority shall be as valid and effective as it would have been if done by all the Trustees. If, however, in the opinion of the Registrar the calling of the meeting of the Trustees is impracticable for any reason, a resolution passed by the unanimous consent of the Trustees by circulation of papers shall be as valid and effective as if passed by the majority of the Trustees at a duly convened Meeting.

15. The office of the Trustees will be honorary and the Trustees are not entitled to draw any remuneration or travelling allowance for carrying out their duties unless the Academy of General Education otherwise directs. The Board of Trustees shall meet from time to time (but not later than 2 months from the meeting held last) as and when necessary to transact business and for considering the betterment of the Trust and its assets. The quorum for the meeting of the Board of Trustees shall be three. The President of the Board of Trustees shall have a casting vote in case of equality of votes. Notice of all Meetings of the Board either by ordinary post or otherwise shall be given to all the Trustees and for this purpose the posting of a communication addressed to the Trustees shall be deemed to be sufficient notice.

16. The Trustees shall cause true and correct accounts to be kept of the sums of moneys received and expended on behalf of the Trust. Once at least in every year, the account of the Trust shall be examined and the correctness of the accounts and the Balance Sheet ascertained by an Auditor appointed by the Trustees and counter-signed by the Auditor and the President of the Board of Trustees. Such audited Balance Sheet shall form an Appendix to the Balance Sheet of the Academy of General Education.

17. Subject as aforesaid, the Trustees shall have ~~power from time to time to make and alter such rules and regulations with regard to the conduct of the business and~~ all matters in respect of any power or duty hereby vested in them, as they may think proper.

18. The Board of Trustees, if they so choose and for the benefit of the Trust, may delegate by means of a resolution in writing any or all of their powers to any one or more of them or any other person or persons for such time and purpose as they deem fit.

19. The Registrar shall be the person authorised to execute or negotiate all the necessary papers and documents such as promotes, bills, cheques, hundis or any other negotiable or non-negotiable instruments such as bonds, mortgages

pledges, agreements, conveyances, transfers, etc., and he shall also have power to receive moneys and other assets, to grant receipts and discharges on behalf of the Trust.

20. The Registrar shall be the person authorised also to negotiate transfer and give discharge for all Government and other securities including Government Promissory Notes, National Savings Certificates, Treasury Bonds, Municipal and other loans and debentures, shares of Joint stock companies and insurance policies assigned to or standing in the name of Kasturba Medical College Trust, Kasturba Medical College, hospital and any other institution connected therewith and to collect all interest, dividends and other moneys receivable in respect of the above.

21. Should any occasion arise for any proceedings to be instituted or defended in any Court Civil, Criminal or Revenue or before any authorities such as District Board, Municipality, Income-tax Department, Education Department, Registration Department, Postal Authorities or any tribunal constituted by law, the Registrar or such other person or persons as are to be appointed in this behalf by means of a resolution by the Board of Trustees alone shall be competent to represent the Trust, to sign and verify plaints, pleadings, applications, to compromise or refer to arbitration whole or any part of the claim by or against the Trust and he alone shall be competent to engage Lawyers and to take all necessary steps and incur all expenses in that behalf.

22. The Trustees shall be at liberty to add to or alter or abrogate any of the provisions of the Trust consistent with the objects of the Trust, provided that such resolution has the support of all the "elected Trustees".

23. The Trustees are wholly indemnified against any expense and losses incurred or suffered or any payments made by them in the administration of the Trust and such expenses, losses and payments shall be borne by the Trust and none of the Trustees shall in any way be personally liable, or responsible for the same except to the extent mentioned in para 13 (e) supra.

24. The object of the Trust is to establish, manage and run the Kasturba Medical College, its hostel, maternity homes and hospitals at Manipal or in such other places as the Board of Trustees may from time to time decide. All such connected institutions, the properties and assets attached to or belonging to them or moneys received by them or standing in their names shall be deemed to be the properties of this Trust and shall be controlled and managed by it. The Registrar shall have the same powers and responsibilities in respect of such properties, assets and moneys as he has in respect of the other assets of this Trust. He may, however, keep separate accounts in respect of each institution and transfer the funds of one institution to another as and when found necessary. In case the said College ceases to exist or function, the entire Trust assets then existing shall revert to and vest in the Author of the Trust.
